

Buy domain names that are variations of your organisation's name.


Look at variations of different letters but also if numbers are replacing letters.

There may be a lot of different possibilities, and this isn't something that should bloom to an excessive cost.




tech precautions: MFA

Add multi-factor
authentication (MFA) to all
key applications.
This means users have to
confirm their identity
before being able to
commence a wire transfer.



tech precautions: MFA

Protect endpoints with more than passwords
Mobile fingerprints
One-time password tokens
Digital certificates
Biometrics



precautions: flag emails

Thyithuing an extra letter added, or damain's .co instead of .com. Your network staff should be able to set up a rule that says when any email enters the system with these variations, it should be flagged.






'Internet is like a giant slot machine delivering variable ratio intermittent re-entorcement' Mary Aiken, Cyberpsychologist

- Spectrum from 'addiction' to healthy; abstinence not viable

6 Tips re Desktop Apps – Raymond Smith

1- Working with Lists in Word and Excel

- Starting file name with date in reverse format (YYYY.MM.DD) allows sorting by date – very useful for briefs / booklets etc
- In MS Explorer select multiple files and 'copy as path' (Shift+right-click->copy as path) – paste to Word to get list of documents
- Manipulate and text in Word using Global Replace (Ctrl+H-> Replace All)
- Replace Folder path / file extensions with *nothing* to get just the file names
- Replace double tab with single tab / double paragraph character with single character / double space with single space
- Replace abbreviation with full word
- Replace wrong case with correct case (Ctrl+H->More->Match Case)

6 Tips re Desktop Apps – Raymond Smith

2- Copying to and from Excel

- Sort in Excel (by date / name etc) before copying and pasting to Word
- Separate word / phrases with tab / comma in Word then copy and paste to Excel to create table format
- Paste back to Word (Right Click Paste Options > Use Destination Styles) to create formatted table
- Copy cells from Excel and paste (Right Click Paste Options -> Keep Text only) to get tab separated list in Word

6 Tips re Desktop Apps – Raymond Smith

3– Using PDF Editors

- PDF editors (e.g. Acrobat Pro / Nuance Power PDF)
- Combine PDF's and other documents into single PDF
- Create indexes using built in functions eg
- Create bookmark for each document when combining
- Rename bookmarks
- Bookmarks options create table of contents
- Paginate automatically by editing header/footer
- Reduce size of PDFs for emailing/data rooms Convert to or save as 'PDF with MRC Compression'
- Redaction functionality in some PDF editors (eg Power PDF Advanced needed for GDPR

4- Word Tips and Shortcuts

- Add buttons to the "Quick Access Toolbar" in Word to reduce time navigating menus / ribbons
- Document compare
- Insert cross references (references only update when printing!)
- "Shrink to Fit" (careful now!)

Paragraphs in Word

- Selecting paragraph with triple click in margin / select words with double click in a word
- Hold down Ctrl to select multiple pieces of text/lines
- Always keep "Show/Hide" turned on (EVEN IF YOU DON'T LIKE IT) if paragraph character highlighted then you copy paragraph formatting Paste unformatted to lose paragraph formatting
- To keep heading with paragraph Right Click -> Paragraph >Line and Page Breaks -> Keep with Next AND do not use blank line to create space after heading - - Right Click -> Paragraph -> Indents and spacing - > Before 12 pts

5- Make All Scanned PDFs Searchable

- Use Server based software to search PDF's ('crawling') and create text searchable layers in that document (optical character recognition – OCR)
- Goes through all old scanned documents and then waits for new scanned documents
- What software: eg Content Crawler by DocsCorp / Symphony OCR by Trumpet Inc
- Get your IT supplier to configure your system (Document Management System or MS Windows Search) to index all PDFs

6- Text Expanders

Text Expanders – expand abbreviations into words/sentences/paragraphs

- Works in all applications emails, PDF editors, explorer
- Allows you to use system information, eg date
- Allows you to place cursor in a given position
- Allows you to fill in information before proceedings
- Examples
 - Name files and documents quickly and consistently
 - Build up your own library of boilerplate paragraphs, phrases, clauses
 - Frequently used names, addresses, phrases
 - Standard form cover emails


- Why should you care?
 - Your data has value
 - Your Identity pricelist on the Dark Web (*Source Experian)
 - Social Security Number: \$1
 - Credit Card Number: \$5-110
 - Credit/Debit Card with CVVV Code: +\$5
 - Full Name, SSN, DOB, Bank Account Number, Security Code: Approx.\$30
 - Driver's License: Approx. \$20
 - Medical Records: \$1-2,000
- Why should your organisation care?
 - GDPR Breach Organisations can be fined up to 4% of their annual global turnover or €20 million, whichever is greater.


Government websites have come under a sustained cyber attack, causing massive disruption for citizens and the public service.










Cyber Risk Management How do we protect ourselves?



Your role in Cyber Risk Management

- You are the most important part of your organisation's security infrastructure
- You have a responsibility to act and protect your organisation's network and data
- If you don't feel that you are sufficiently informed then you should seek to be informed
 - Request a regular update from your IT Department/Service Provider on IT Security and Cyber related matters

Cyber Risk Management - A simple TIP

- Think before you click
 - If it looks too good to be true then it probably is
 - Ask yourself, are you expecting the email/sms?
- Inform your IT department or service provider of any suspicious activity
 - Keep their contact details close to hand
 - Keep your systems up to date and apply software releases and patches in line with any advice issued by your IT department, service provider or vendor
- Protect your passwords
 - Change your passwords regularly
 - Do not share your passwords with anyone
 - Do not use the same password for multiple services
 - Consider using a Password Manager
 - Use two-factor authentication or verification on regularly used services, e.g. Gmail, LinkedIn, Amazon etc

Annual In-House & Public Sector Conference 2019 Cyber Risk Management What should my organisation be doing?

- Liaise with relevant Agencies and Interest groups
 - Government
 - Office of the Government CIO (OGCIO)
 - National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC)
 - Provide regular updates on recent cyber events and activity in addition to recommendations for protection
 - Irish Information Security Forum (IISF)
- Cyber Security Awareness
 - Induction training for new staff
 - Regular Cyber Security Assessments and Training for existing staff
 - Simulated Phishing exercises
 - Typically 25-30% click rate on first attempt. May reduce to 5% or less over 12-18 months (*source SANS.org).
 - Consider Cyber Liability Insurance (where appropriate)

Smart Working/Mobile Technology Why?

- The way that we work is changing
 - Pervasiveness of mobile technology and smart devices
 - Always on and always contactable (24x7)
- The way that people want to work is changing and organisations have to adapt

Smart Working/Mobile Technology NTMA – ICT Transformation

- In 2017 the NTMA decided to move premises from Treasury Building on Grand Canal Street to North Wall Quay
 - Design incorporated an activity based work environment
- Staff and senior management consulted in relation to technology
 - *** Same experience Anywhere, Anytime and on Any Device. ***
- IT department considered the mobility requirements of staff alongside the requirements in relation to data security
 - Both mobility within the building to support activity based working and mobility external to the building
- Virtual Desktop Infrastructure (VDI) chosen as the solution to balance mobility and data security
 - No data residing on the mobile device
 - Full desktop experience with the same applications, look and feel
 - Ability to access in the same way on both corporate and personal devices
- Collaboration tools introduced to support staff interaction and enhance productivity
 - Extended use of Instant Messaging
 - New audio and video capabilities
- In Q3 2019, 800+ staff moved to the new location in North Wall Quay
 - Positive move experience
 - Classroom and 1-to-1 training sessions provided to support staff in adopting the new technology

 - Challenge Productivity versus being visually present
- Work flexibly and cost effectively






larnroid Eireann is urging commuters to change the time they usually get their trains in order to make their journey to work more comfortable.
